- ensure that all employees are aware of their responsibility for their own and health and safety and that of those with whom they work;
- provide and maintain safe equipment and provide information, instruction and supervision to ensure that all employees are competent to undertake tasks in a safe manner;
- prevent accidents and cases of work-related ill health and maintain safe and healthy working conditions;
- maintain and implement a detailed Health & Safety Policy and related documents setting out responsibilities, organisation and arrangements;
- review health and safety performance and revise the Policy and associated documents as necessary at regular intervals.
